PIE IN SKY METRO ANNOUNCEMENT WON'T FOOL THE PEOPLE OF NSW

NSW Premier Gladys Berejiklian and NSW Transport Minister Andrew Constance's pie in the sky metro plan is a clumsy election stunt to fool the people of NSW just eight days away from polling day.

The Premier and Transport Minister announced a plan for a plan for a metro network that looked like something hastily worked out on the back of an envelope.

Ms Berejiklian and Mr Constance refused to give any details, such as how much their proposed project will cost, when it would begin, and when it was likely to be completed.

Despite not announcing a single savings measure over the course of the election campaign, the NSW Liberals and Nationals grandiose metro plan proposes four metro lines without any indication as to how much the project would cost, or the impact on the state budget.

NSW Shadow Minister for Transport Jodi McKay said, "Today's announcement from Premier Berejiklian and Minister Constance is nothing but a desperate election stunt.

"The Premier and her Transport Minister think the people of NSW will take them seriously when they present something that looks like it was written up on the back of an envelope, that is totally uncoded. It just reeks of desperation.

"Premier Berejiklian and Minister Constance haven't been able to finish one single project over their entire time in government, but instead of trying to clean up the mess they've made of the Sydney Light Rail and of Westconnex, they're going around spruiking this new pie in the sky project.

"If the NSW Liberals think they can pull the wool over the eyes of the people of NSW with this pie in the sky announcement, they've got another thing coming."
